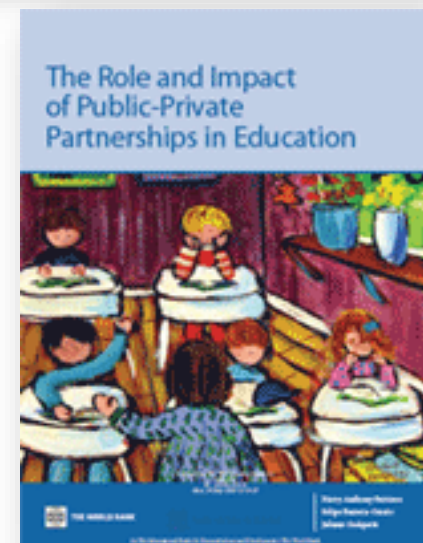

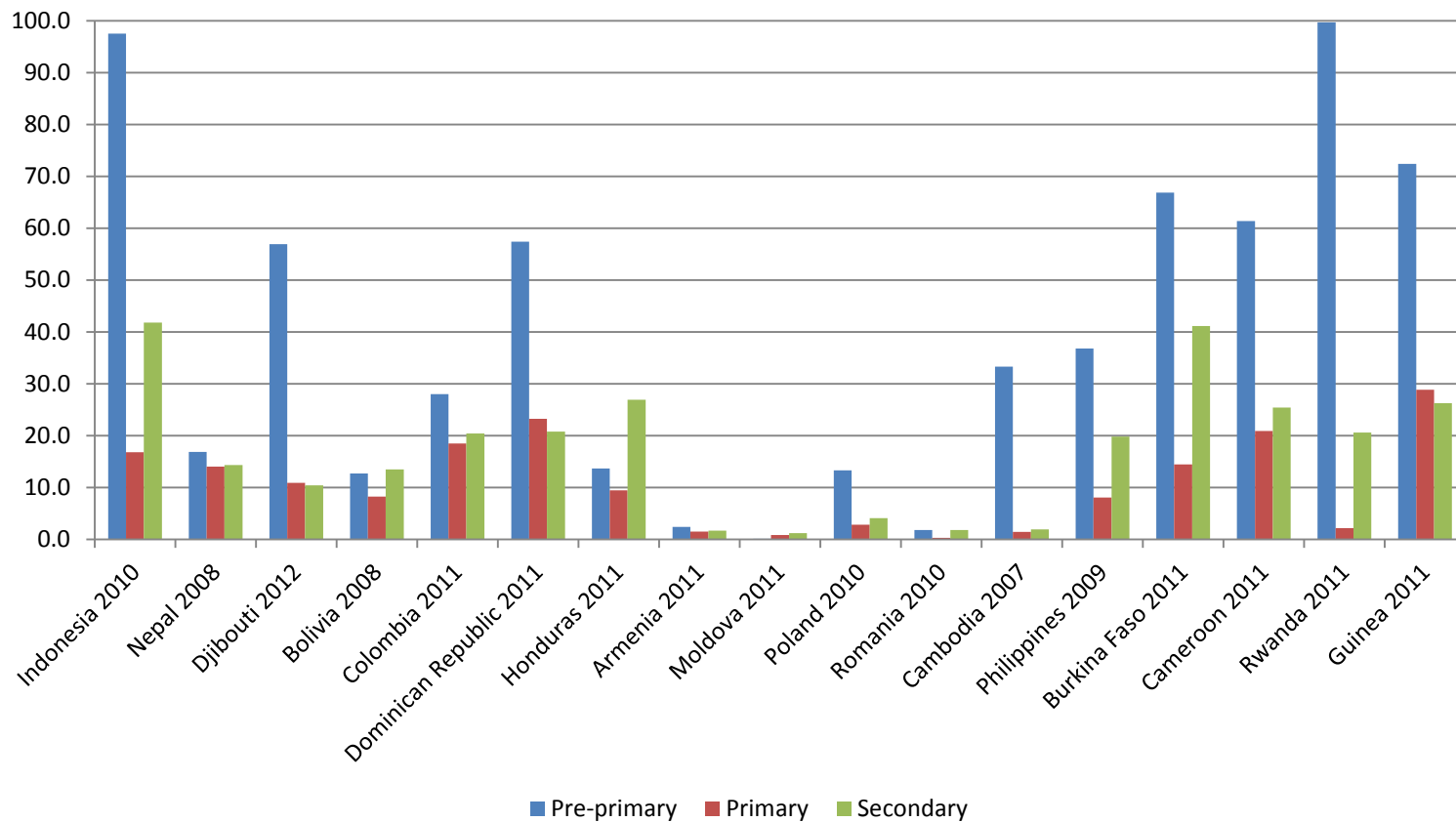

Significant share of education in developing countries are delivered by private providers.

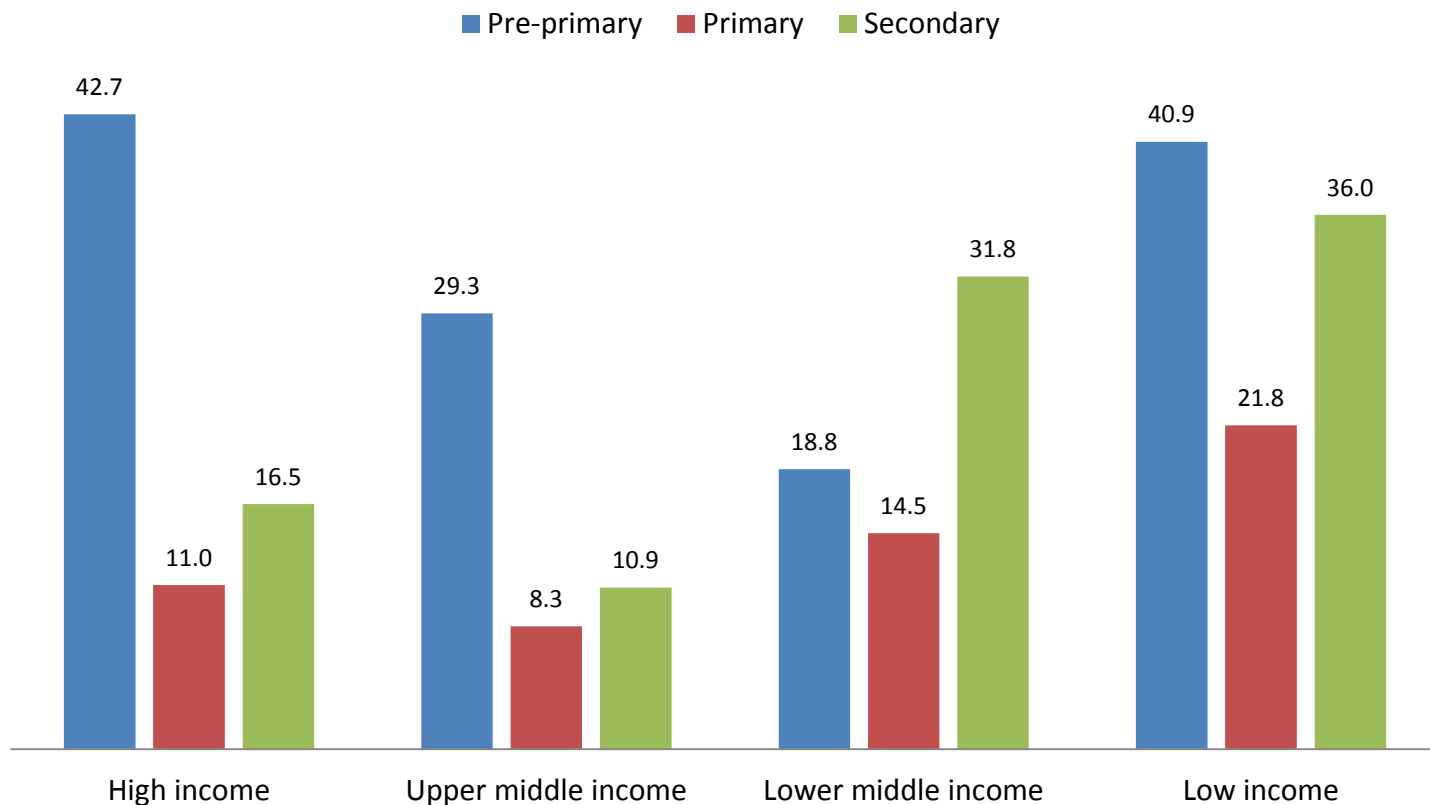
Private Enrollment Share (%)





Significant share of education in developing countries are delivered by private providers.

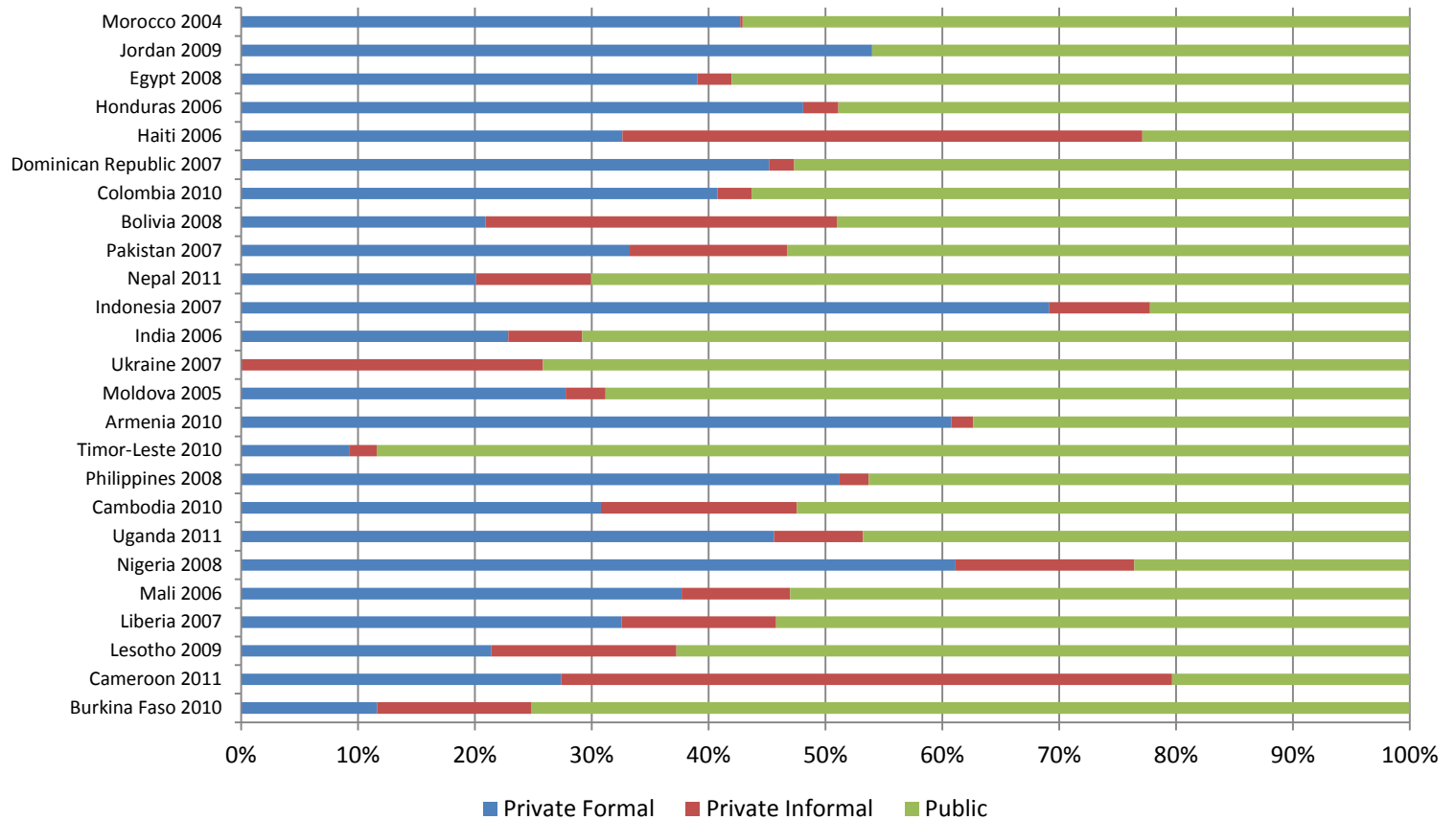
Private Enrollment Share by National Income, 2011





Significant share of health services in developing countries are delivered by private providers.

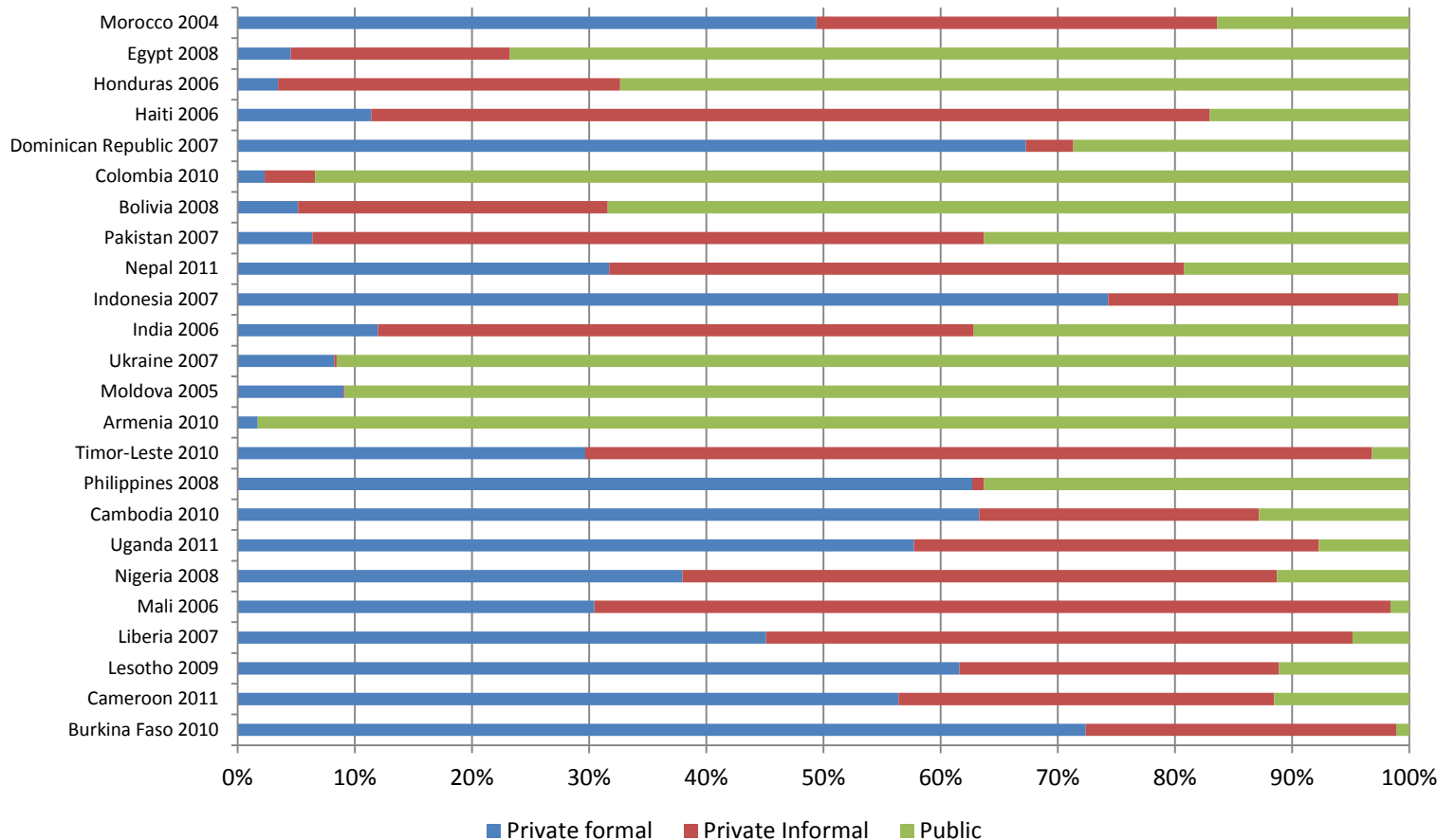
Source of Supply for Modern Contraceptive Methods





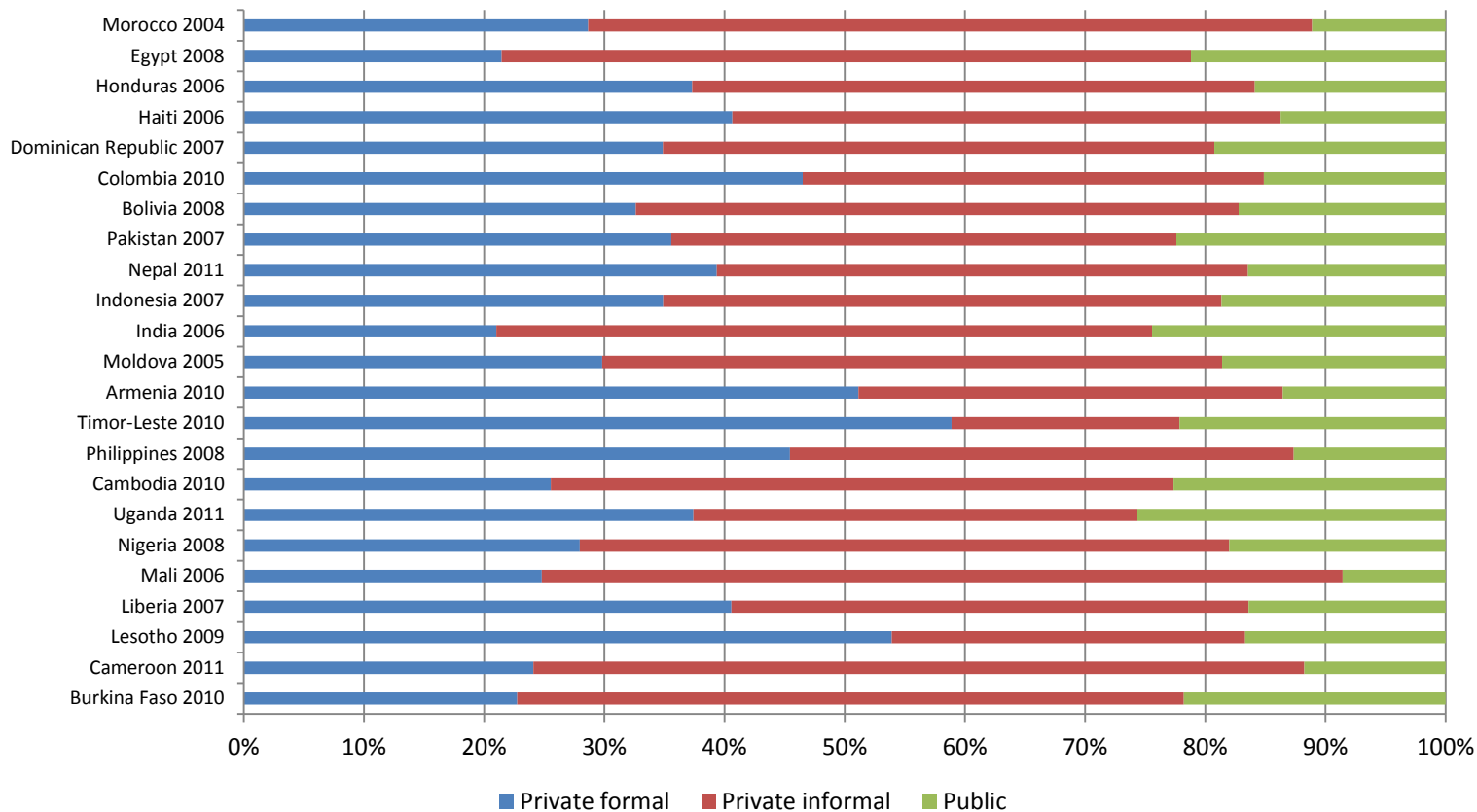

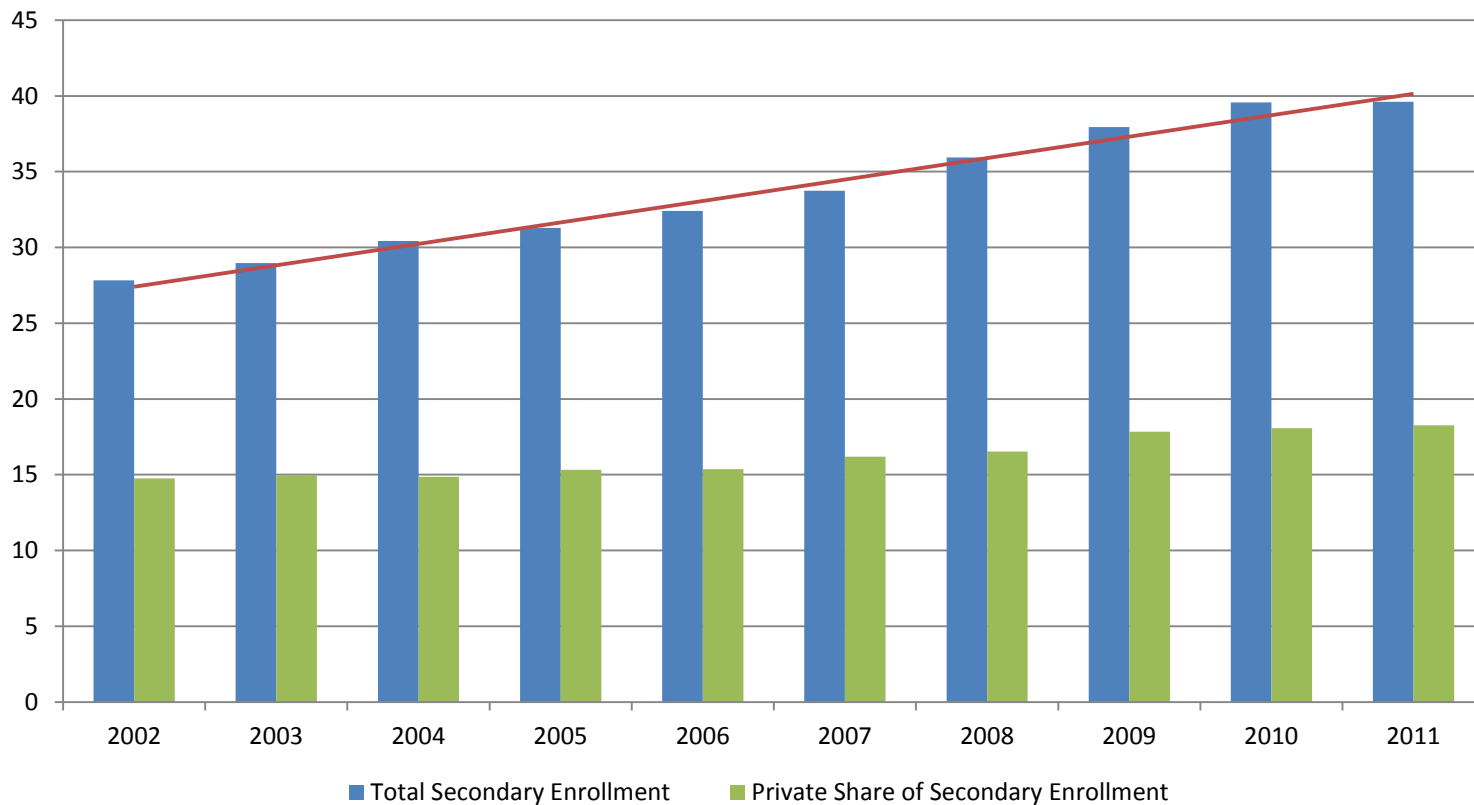

Growing demand and private share in secondary education in Africa

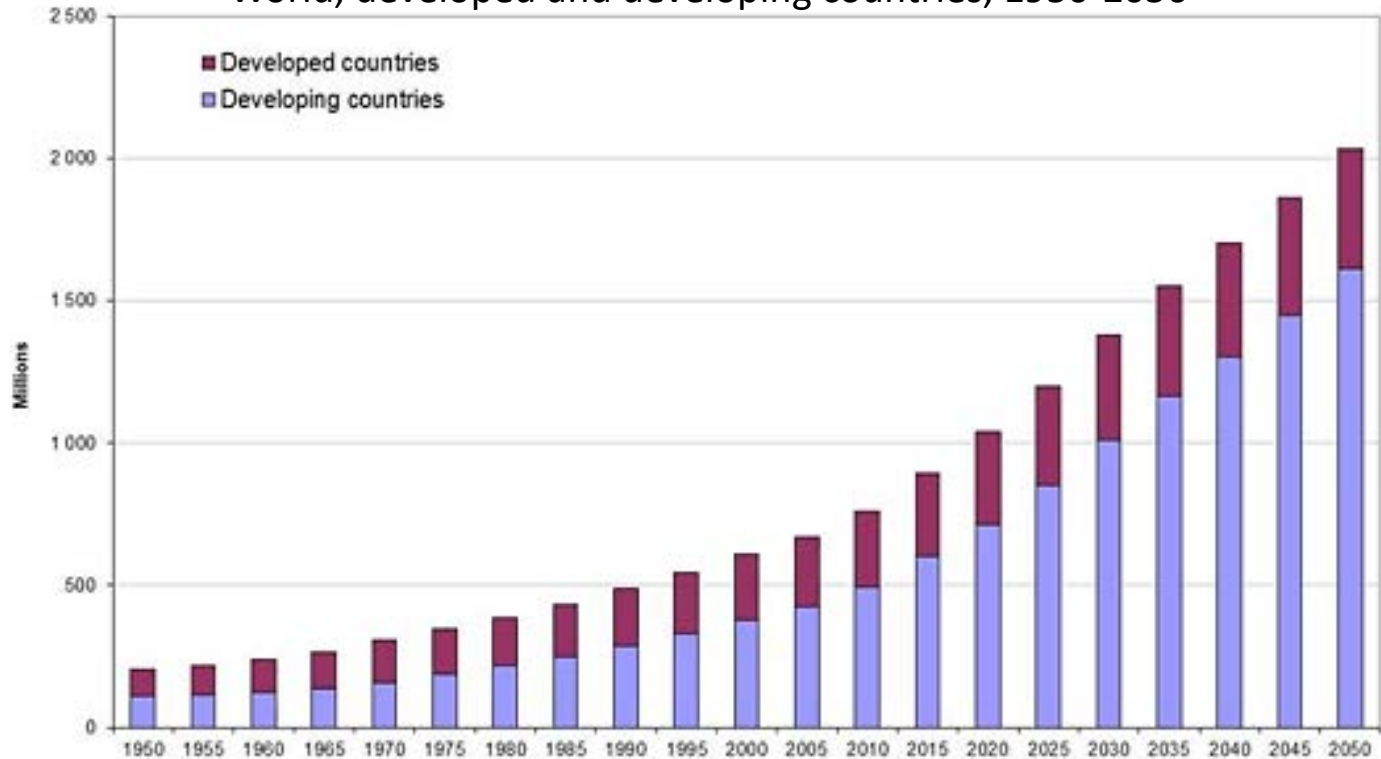
Secondary Enrollment Rate in Sub-Saharan Africa

It is progressing fastest in developing countries, including in countries with large populations of young people.

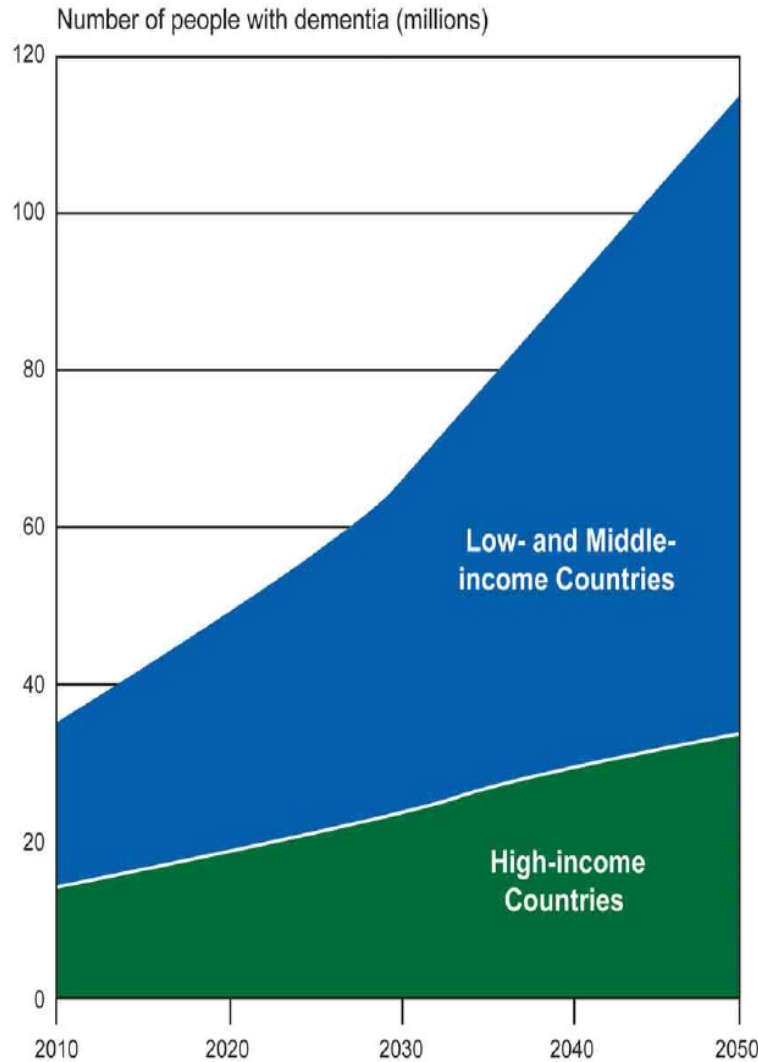

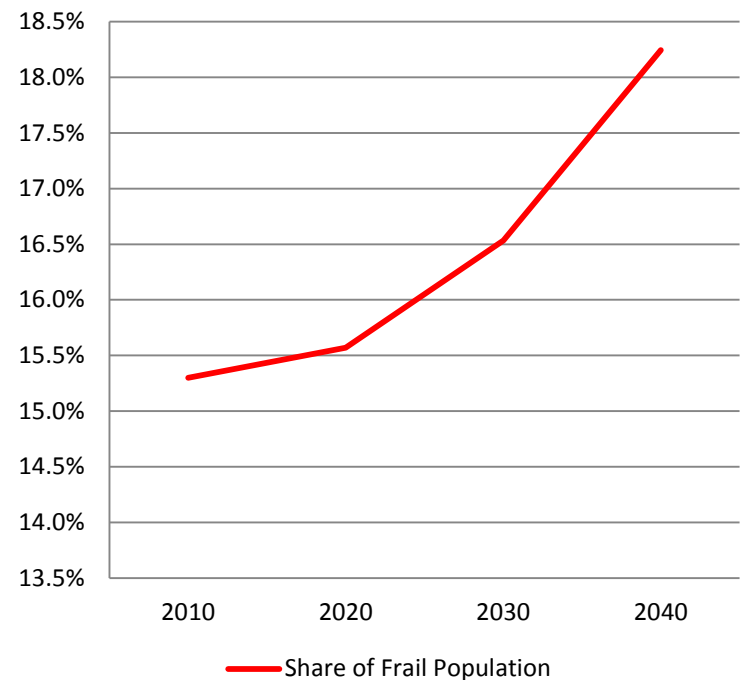
